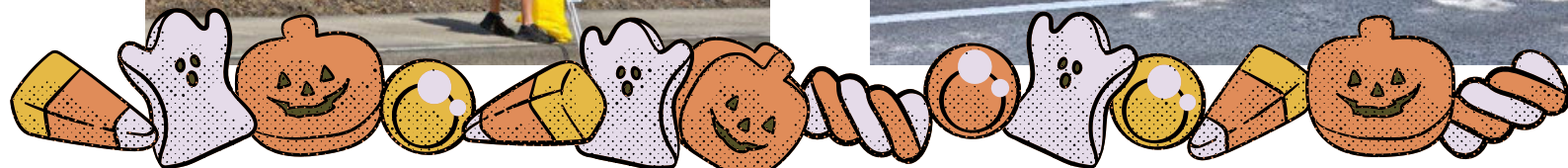

Writing articles for the bulletin never really starts out as a planned topic. It is almost always a dialogue of ‘What is on my mind’ and this month is no exception.

It was a short sixteen days ago that the dark paneling resided in the Lodge room. Since then it has been removed, sheetrock repaired, textured, and painted. It should be no surprise that reassembly takes longer than demolition, and we are slowly working through that. Please be patient as we get this done. The plan is to do it right the first time, rather than rushing to a mediocre result.

Looking back to the October 2022 bulletin, there was an article titled “Where’s that money go???” , submitted by our Lodge Treasurer. ENF display, Absent member board, and US Map Lodge pin projects are all at various states of progress, but have not been forgotten.

Other projects have been added to the list and completed since then too: new camera system, new speaker system, new Point-of-Sale system, Jukebox, reactivate the back bar, and probably a few more I am missing. Many of these seem simple on the surface but have a surprising amount of work involved.

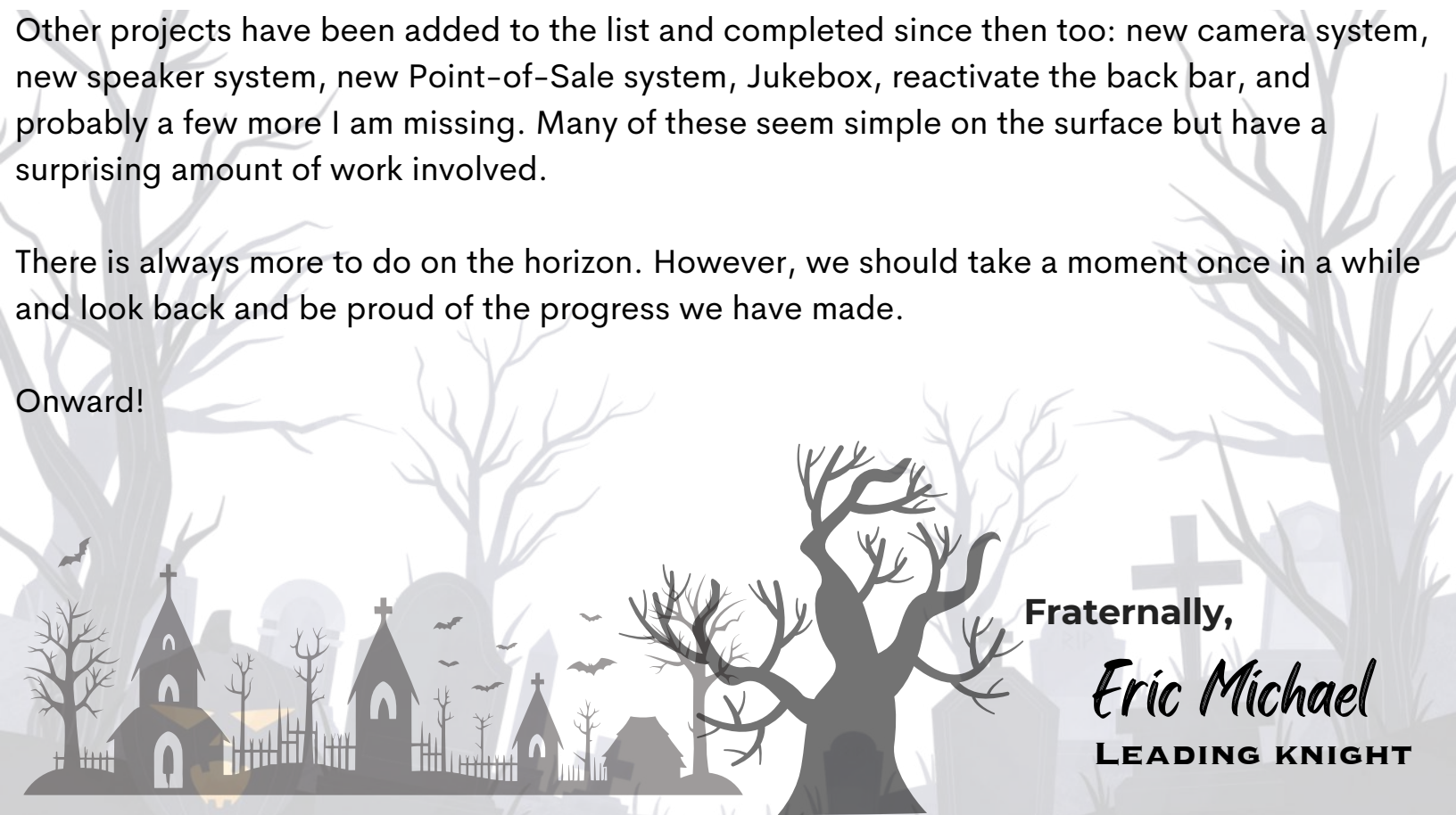
There is always more to do on the horizon. However, we should take a moment once in a while and look back and be proud of the progress we have made.



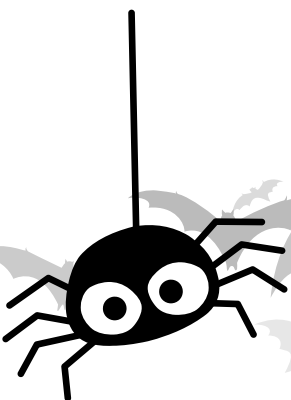

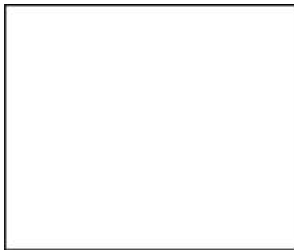
