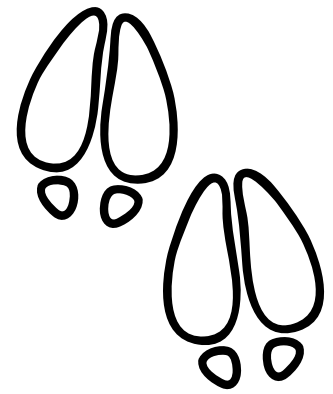
Unforgettable High School Memories

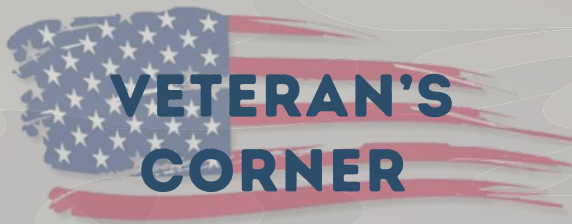

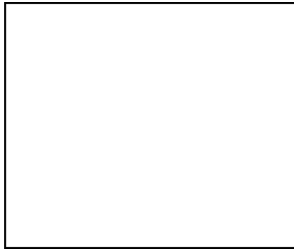
