Elks Student of the Month

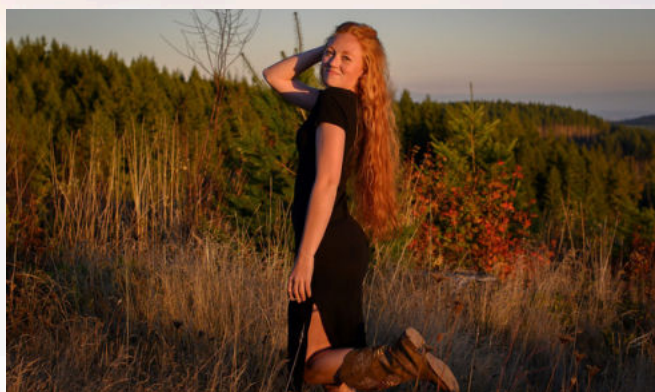
The St. Helens High School is proud to announce our December Elks Student of the Month: Miss Savannah Augustus!

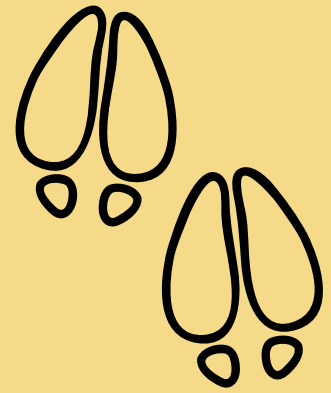

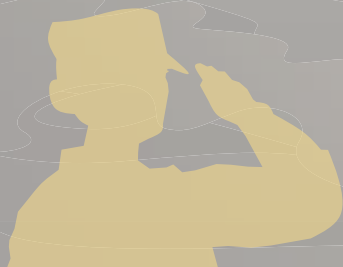

Good food, dedicated volunteers, and of course the Lodge Members and their guests that we see each month—all combine into an experience I deeply enjoy, and which has made my family and I feel very welcome.

Each month, we take the funds raised by Spaghetti Night and apply them to a worthy charity selected by the volunteers. Previous charities include:

- Veterans' Out of the Darkness Suicide Prevention Walk
- The Lodge Room remodel
- Keith's Kids foster children program

Each charity deserves every penny, and it's always challenging to select one; but this December, with Christmas quickly approaching, we wanted to do something a little different.

Every year the St. Helens Elks Lodge sets up a giving tree for families that need a little holiday assistance. There are gift tags on the tree, but also a list of necessities to help defray the costs of everyday life. This month Spaghetti Night had a record attendance—106 diners—which netted us \$1,022. Fellow Elk Doug Stokes and I took that money to Grocery Outlet and overflowed eight carts with those necessities: laundry detergent, paper towels, sandwich baggies, you name it. Ricky Linares, owner of Grocery Outlet and a Lodge Member in good standing, kicked in an additional 10% off everything we purchased, stretching our dollars even further. We even had enough left over to snag seven \$20 fuel cards.

Loading all these items into carts was the first time I've had a visible, physical representation of Spaghetti Night's charity, and it was deeply moving. Look at everything we purchased—that is the power of YOUR generosity. This is the collective ability of the Elks to change lives; individually, it's a plate or two (or three, you know who you are, be proud) of spaghetti, but look at what it adds up to. Look at what we can do! I, of course, am a new member—many of you have seen these charities in action for years, but this is my first rodeo, so while I offer you my heartfelt thanks, it comes with a challenge: let's blow away next month's charity, too. Pack the house. Tell your friends and bring guests. Clean us out of every last noodle and every last bite of sauce! And don't forget—the first Lodge meeting of every month you have a chance to win spaghetti for two on me with your pot drawing tickets!

Finally, please join me in saying thank you to my steadfast volunteers: Bruce Durham, Rolland Kane, Mark Kreutzer, Doug Babcock, and Cliff Multanen. I'm just Spaghetti Night's pretty face; they're the ones that make it happen. Just don't tell them about "packing the house".

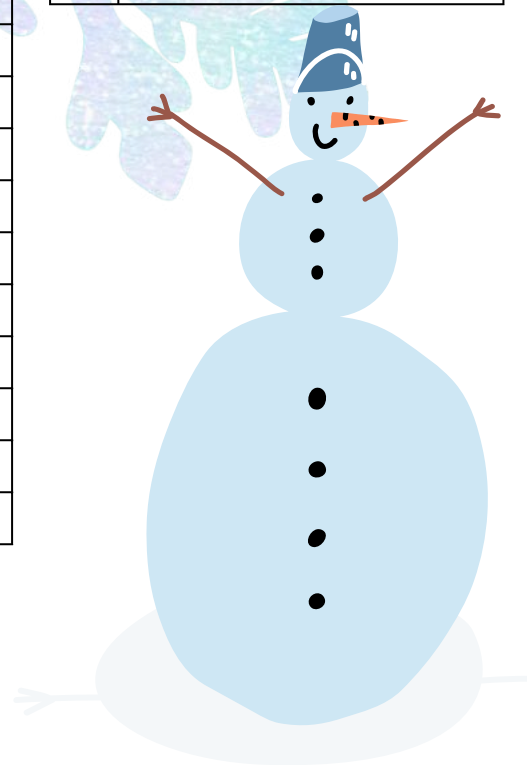

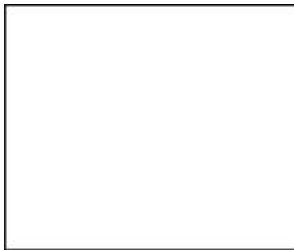
