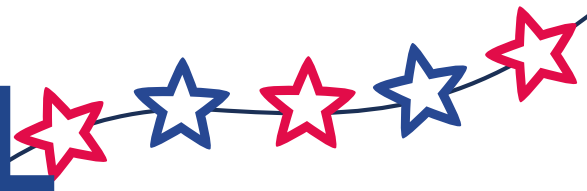

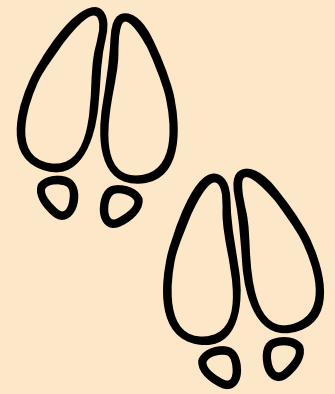
Special Guest Speaker: Becky Ellis

I'm just back from the Fall Seminar in Salem, and there are always exciting updates on some of our favorite projects. For example, did you know that the Oregon State Elks offers a vocational grant? The Oregon State Elks Association funds five vocational grants every year, each worth \$2,000. There is no age restriction on who may apply, and the grant is open to anyone interested. These grants are intended solely for vocational or technical schooling and may not be used as a stepping stone to a 4-year program.

[<https://app.smartsheet.com/b/form/0d22f4c59aa94f8eb535c625003ac744>] under "What We Do." It is writable once downloaded and saved. The application deadline is March 1 of each year, with winners announced in May and funding available in late August.

Drug Awareness News:

"For the first time in decades, public health data shows a sudden and hopeful drop in drug overdose deaths across the U.S." (NPR). While this is great news, there's still much work ahead. It's important to be aware of the signs of an opioid overdose. Often, the person is unresponsive, but they may also be struggling to breathe. Other signs include blue lips or fingertips, or small pupils, which may indicate that the person is overdosing and in need of Narcan.

Please note, Narcan isn't harmful if the person is unresponsive for reasons other than an opioid overdose, so when in doubt, administer Narcan!

Don't forget, there are upcoming events where our District Drug Awareness Chair, Anna, could use some help staffing and distributing information.

Keep in mind there will be around 20 families receiving food. Some of them will be larger than others so they will get more food than smaller families, which makes cases of food ideal donations.

St. Helens Elks Support Community with Warm Welcome Events and Teen Room Project

The St. Helens Elks grant team has been hard at work supporting our community! In October, we hosted two Warm Welcome events in St. Helens and Scappoose. These events invited low-income families from the local Head Start programs to their city library, where librarians shared free literary resources, books, and fun activities. Afterward, local Elks members helped fit each child with a coat, hat, and gloves to keep them warm this winter. So far, we've provided 73 coats to families in need!

Head Start also expressed concerns that many students didn't have socks or underwear, so we provided socks at the event as well. We are continuing to accept donations of new children's socks and underwear in the donation barrel located in the Lodge lobby.

Coming in November, we will host Warm Welcome programs in Vernonia on November 2 and Clatskanie on November 23. If you're interested in volunteering, please contact Annette Pixley.

In addition, a grant was received to create a Teen Room at the local DHS office. Previously, teens who came into the office—sometimes after being removed from their homes—had to wait in an empty room. This room is now a comfortable space for teens who are waiting for foster placement or taking a short break from their foster family, and also for sibling visits. Thanks to the grant, the Lodge provided books, art supplies, video games, a couch, drinks, and more to make the room inviting.

The DHS team expressed their gratitude, saying:

"We truly believe that our community has what our kids need, and that people in these young ones' neighborhoods will do what they can to keep children whole and safe. You are helping us believe in that vision. Your mission to support these teens is not unseen. This is how we change the world we live in."

A special thank you to the grant team, Angie Cook and Megan Bubar, and to all the Lodge members who helped shop for coats, fit kids for warm winter gear, build furniture, and set up the Teen Room. We couldn't have done it without you!

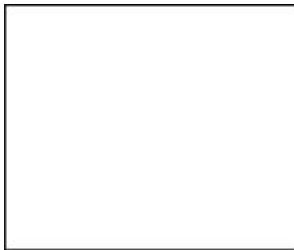
