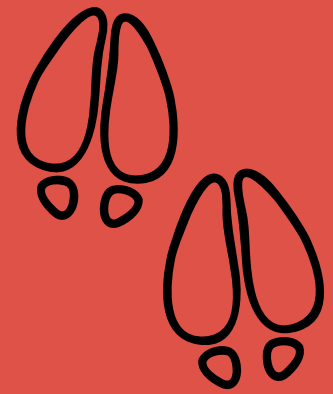

According to AmeriCorps' Volunteering and Civic Life in America research, approximately 60.7 million Americans formally volunteered with organizations between September 2020 and 2021, contributing around 4.1 billion hours in total. “From your Leading Knight”

The Road Ahead

In October, I had the privilege of attending the Oregon State Elks Association Fall Seminar, hosted by the Salem Lodge. This event, historically referred to as the “Leading Knight Seminar,” focuses on preparing the current Leading Knight for their upcoming service as Exalted Ruler.



True to that purpose, I received a well-organized and informative binder filled with valuable information essential for the role. A core element of this resource is a month-by-month guide outlining what an Exalted Ruler should be doing and planning for.

While not specific to any one Lodge’s unique activities, the binder provides a comprehensive overview of Elkdom’s requirements. Additionally, it includes tasks to address in the months leading up to the next Lodge year, which begins in April 2025.

Planning for the Next Lodge Year

The preparation process starts now! December marks the time to begin identifying members to fill Officer and Committee positions for the upcoming Lodge year. According to Section 12.010 of Grand Lodge statutes, the Exalted Ruler-elect is responsible for appointing five Officer positions. While official decisions cannot be made until after the February 2025 elections, I am pleased to share that Dean Lemire has graciously agreed to serve his 18th year as Lodge Organist.

This still leaves the positions of Esquire, Chaplain, Inner Guard, and Tiler to be determined. In Elkdom, these appointed Officer roles are often seen as stepping stones to elected office and further Lodge service. They provide an excellent opportunity for members to become involved in leadership without committing to the multi-year journey of “going through the chairs” (Officers) or “running the table” (Trustees). Appointees gain firsthand experience in the inner workings of St. Helens Lodge #1999 and make meaningful contributions to the success of the Lodge.

Committee Opportunities

In addition to Officer positions, Section 13.020 requires a newly installed Exalted Ruler to fill the Standing Committees with dedicated members. These include Auditing & Accounting, Activities, Public Relations, and Fraternal Committees. All of these committees play vital roles in ensuring the Lodge’s success, and we need enthusiastic, engaged members to participate. Your Invitation to Get Involved

The Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks is an extraordinary organization, and I am incredibly proud to be part of it. St. Helens Lodge #1999 is a leader within Elkdom, and that’s something we can all take pride in. 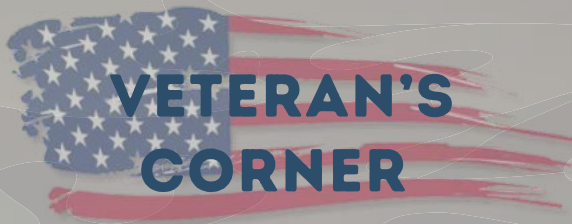

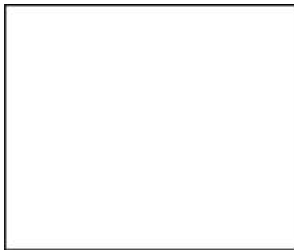
