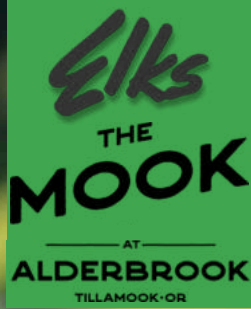

Our Lodge has assisted military families over the past couple of months, and we want you to know that your support of the Veterans Committee makes this possible. I thank you, as do the veterans and their families.

The VA has added male breast cancer, urethral cancer, and cancer of the paraurethral glands to its list of presumptive illnesses linked to burn pit and environmental toxin exposure. This update, part of the PACT Act, enables affected veterans to expedite disability compensation and health care benefits. The VA's decision follows a review of scientific data and veterans' claims, targeting support for those who served in the Persian Gulf War and post-9/11 operations. Over 1 million PACT Act claims have been approved, with \$5.7 billion awarded. Benefits for these newly recognized cancers will be backdated to August 10, 2022.

VA Secretary Denis McDonough emphasized the VA's commitment to timely health care and benefits for toxic-exposed veterans and their families. This change simplifies access to benefits, as veterans no longer need to prove direct causation between their cancers and military service.
