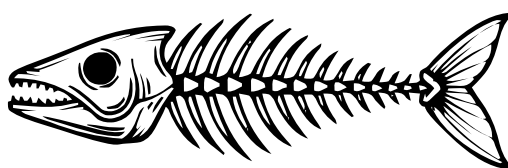
**Total raised this year - \$12,081**

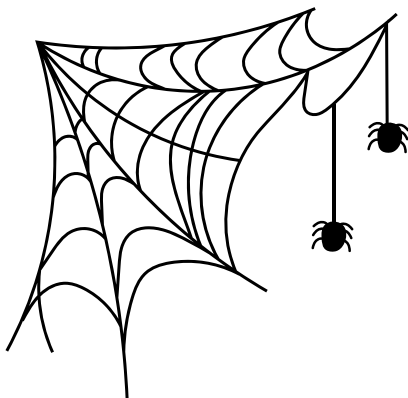

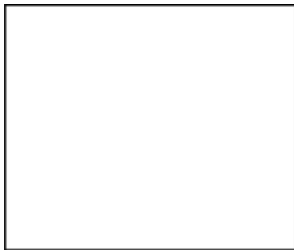
