On Sunday, March 30th, our Veterans committee co-hosted a very special event here for our local Vietnam Era Veterans in recognition of the 50th Anniversary of the end of the Vietnam War. This was a joint event co-hosted and funded with organizations throughout the county and led by Alta Lynch – Elks Lodge #1999, Erin Nolan, - Columbia County Veteran Service Officer, and Ashley Taylor – Department of Veterans Affairs Community Engagement & Partnerships Coordinator. The event was open to ALL veterans and offered completely free to all in attendance.

Our lodge and our community stepped up big time both to volunteer and to support financially (feeding ~200+ a multi-course meal costs a pretty penny!).

While there was a planning committee led by Alta, she had help from several lodge members, key community veteran support leaders, local businesses and even groups like the L.O.E. We had the Inaugural Ball the night before so folks showed up the next morning to transform the Lodge from formal affair to patriotic and welcoming.



Just before 4 pm, people began filing in despite some very heavy rains. Everyone had to pre-register, so as they checked in they got name tags that designated them as a Vietnam Era Veteran, a Veteran or a supporter of Veterans. The different name tag got you different gifts as you enter and throughout the event. Vietnam Vets got a special commemorative coin during the event and all veterans got gift bags as they left. The Vietnam Veterans left with their arms full between between handmade blankets, pillows, pocket knives and many other unique gifts. So many heartfelt thank yous have been received for the event, the message and the gifts.



When all was said and done, a great meal and program was provided to well over 200 people that afternoon with over 50 Vietnam vets in attendance in addition to other veterans. The speakers provided thanks and gratitude to the veterans that served and education to all. It was an incredible event for our veterans & our community. Our Lodge should be proud of our support and participation.

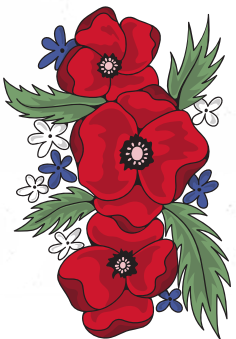

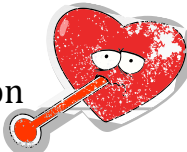

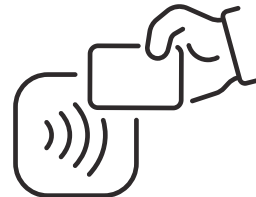

“From your Loyal Knight”

....Rewarded as they shall deserve

Howdy Lodge #1999, this is Frank Bellinger, your Loyal Knight.

Let me start with a heartfelt thank you to all Members that made it out for April's Spaghetti Night. We served 107 attendees, and together with Sherwood Elks Lodge #2342 (which kicked in \$1,288 from their Members), we raised a whopping \$3,569 for Burns Elks Lodge #1680 to use as they help their community recover from the Silvies River floods. I am working with their Secretary to coordinate other donations, such as clothing and household items--more on that to come. I might sound like a broken record at this point, but the charitable nature of our Lodge continues to amaze me.



Speaking of charity (check out this monster segue): In his Summa Theologica, St. Thomas Aquinas breaks down the two components of charity: beneficence and benevolence. Beneficence is an exterior disposition whereby we do good for others through our actions. On the other hand, Aquinas defines benevolence as an interior disposition, a "movement of the will rooted in love for God and neighbor." It is the desire for the ultimate good of others. Benevolence is unique in this relationship, for while beneficence requires resources or the means to act, benevolence is achievable by all. Together, through the desire for each other's good and the act of providing for it, these two traits create the virtue of Charity.

An important note is that benevolence is independent of friendship, which most often comes with an expectation of reciprocity. It should also not be conflated with acceptance, as servility for the sake of social harmony denotes a lack of self-respect that would render any "movement of the will" impossible. In short, benevolence doesn't require that we agree with each other, or even like each other--but it does require that we seek the good of and for each other freely, as we as Elks have sworn before each other to do. This is our Obligation.

I'll hop off my soapbox there, with apologies to the Lecturing and Leading Knights for treading all over their respective territories. I myself pledge to work on a more benevolent attitude towards Taco Tuesday, despite the fact that the Latin root words for "spaghetti" (spa-, 'food' and -ghetti, 'of the gods') means that every second Wednesday of the month we each take one step closer to the divine.

This concludes my first month as Loyal Knight. I made it!

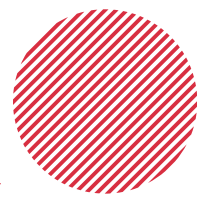

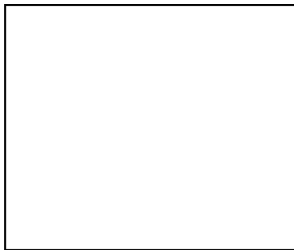
