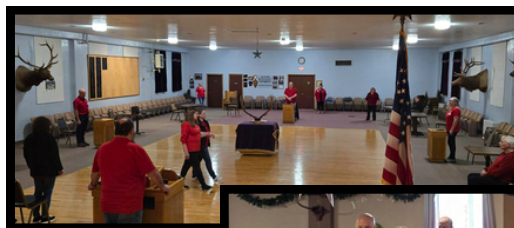

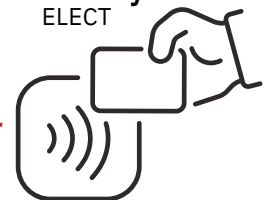

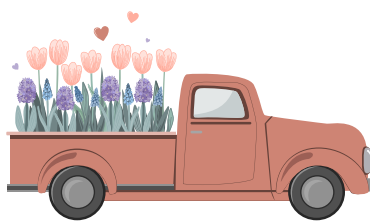
“From your Leading Knight”

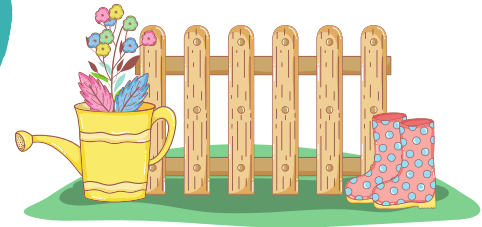

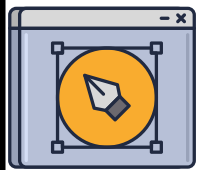

NOTE FROM THE BULLETIN EDITOR



When I agreed to take over the Lodge Bulletin back in 2020, I really had no idea what I was taking on. I quickly realized we had opportunity to improve our overall online presence, our basic technology practices and communication with members.

What started with updating the bulletin format evolved into, sort of by accident, establishing the Technical Committee for our Lodge. After 10+ years in marketing industry, I knew where to start for much on the online presence, but the "Tech" Committee quickly expanded into covering everything from POS replacement to routers to websites. Many Tech Team members have *far* more knowledge than I on these subjects and took lead. I'm definitely not the "techy" of the Tech Committee! It's a great group of people willing to lend their various expertise and/or simply dive in and do some research so we can help make better recommendations to the board.

The Bulletin itself has changed ALOT over the past 4 years (see above right). We have incredible open rates on our emails in general, but especially on the new monthly bulletins, and now reach more members than ever before. Our website is current and regularly brings in new member interest. It's been fun, but personal & work obligations have made it harder and harder to achieve the deadlines and publish the bulletin in the timeframe needed. As a result, I asked incoming ER Ron Summers to work to find a new Bulletin Editor this coming lodge year. This is the last bulletin solely handled by me. New member, Candace Atnip, has been shadowing me the last several weeks and will begin taking the lead with the May bulletin. I will still handle event postings, slide decks, much of the website maintenance, emails, etc for now. Some of that will eventually transition to Candace as she masters the basics, but I plan to remain the Tech Chair and stay involved. The goal is for this to free up my time to work on some larger initiatives that have been back-burnered due to bandwidth that aren't as deadline driven. We have some great ideas in the works, but they will take some time to implement.

Thank you for patience and support over the last few years. I'll thank you in advance for supporting Candace as she tackles the new role. All the processes will remain the same for submitting bulletin articles and requesting events. Emailing bulletin@StHelensElks.org will begin forwarding to her as well for questions.

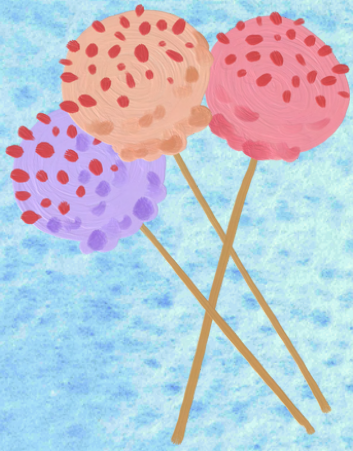

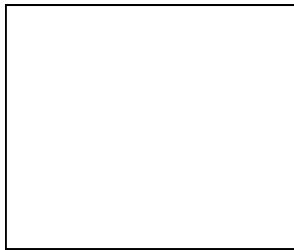
