On top of that, your donations to the giving tree made Christmas for EIGHT local families. WELL DONE Lodge #1999.



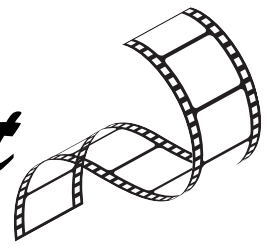

Pictures from the Past



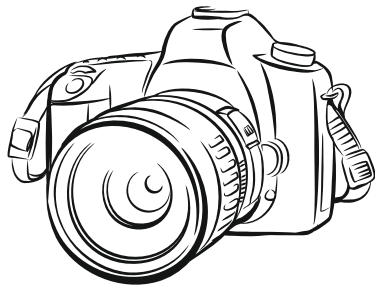

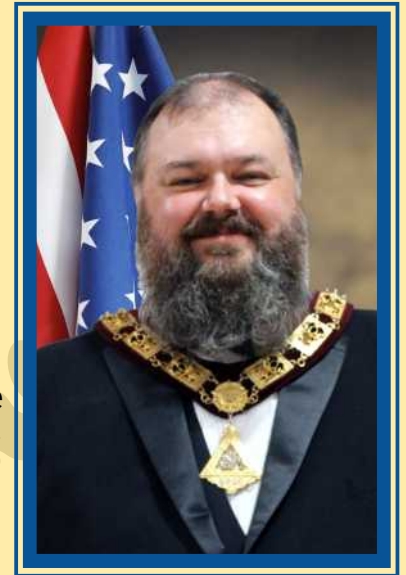
To my fellow Elks,

Happy New Year Everyone!

It is hard to write about January...when it is still December. OK, here goes. Dues. That's a four-letter word. Dues notices will be mailed out in late

January or early February. The mailing is cheaper than I could have done it...and it means your secretary does not have to stuff 900 pieces of mail. That works for me.

You can pay online if you like, or mail your payment to our office, or bring it in during office hours. Please do NOT pay at the bar! Sometimes it takes more than 2 weeks for that payment to travel from the bar to my office. If the office is not open, just put your payment and invoice through the mail slot on the office door. I will find it.

Remember, please, that your plastic door key card (it looks like a motel room card)...is PERMANENT. It opens the front inner door for you. If you lose it or throw it away, the replacement card will cost you \$25.

I do have some news about the amount you need to pay. Our lodge share has not changed, but State Elks and Grand Lodge have increased their share to be collected to \$40. I guess the good news is that, at last we do NOT have to deal with that fifteen cents thing any more. Dues for regular members will total \$145, and for life members, it will be \$90. The Elks membership year runs from April 1 to March 31 the following year. Elections for next year's officers (including secretary) will be held in February.

YOU DO NOT HAVE TO BE A VETERAN TO VOLUNTEER WITH US!

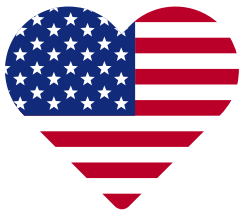

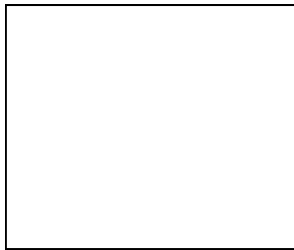
