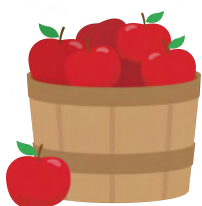

The 2024-2025 Membership Report was filed online via CLMS2. As of March 31, the Order ended the year with a total membership of 791,601, with a net gain of 2,002 (a +0.25% increase). The Order totaled 71,211 initiated Members during the year, as well.

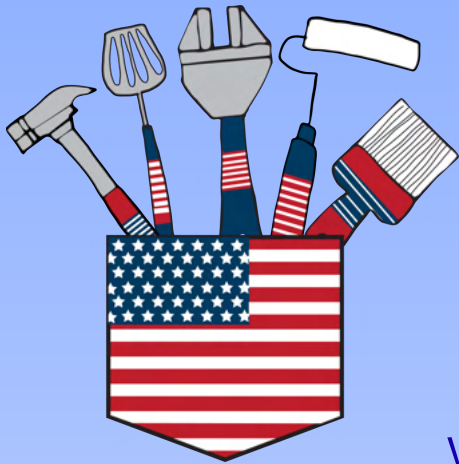

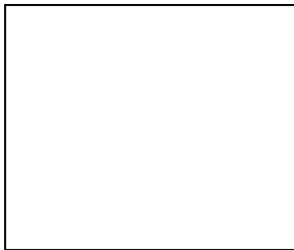
