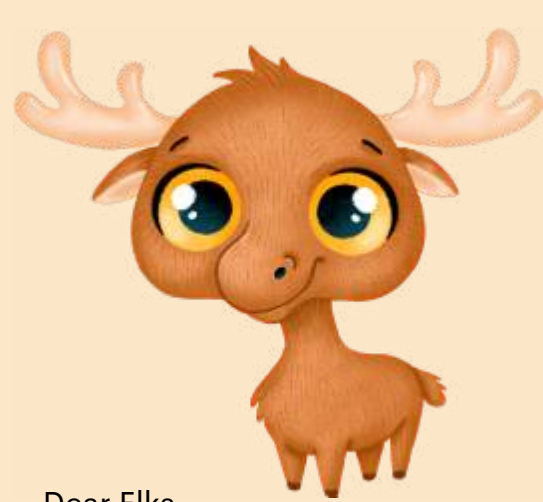

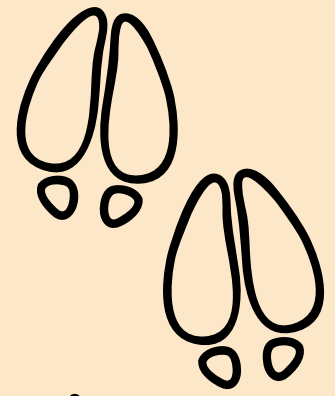

From your Trustee - Elks 1999 Lodge Room Remodel

When?

Between September 8th and the afternoon of September 19th, the trustees will be leading the Lodge room remodeling project.

What is happening?

The scope of this work includes removing items, taking down the existing paneling, and scraping the glue off the walls. After this step, a contractor will come in to seal the walls, apply a skim coat (creating a new surface), and then spray texture onto the walls. Once this is complete, the Lodge room walls will be primed and painted.

Completion date?

The overall goal is to hold the regular Lodge meeting on the night of the 19th. We need your help on Sunday, September 8th, at 11 a.m.! (or anytime between 11 a.m. – 5 p.m.). The goal is to complete the removal of items in the Lodge room, take down the paneling, and scrape the walls. Watch for the sign-up sheet at the next meeting or sign up at the bar.

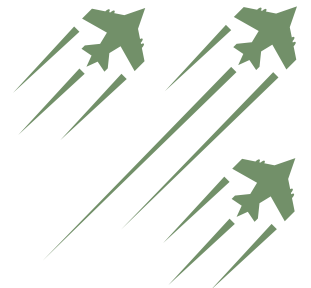

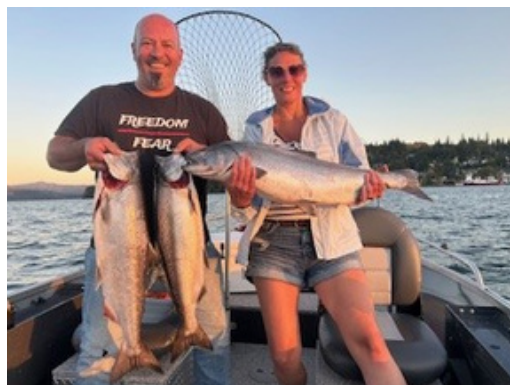
Congratulations to Garrett, Our Winning Bidder!

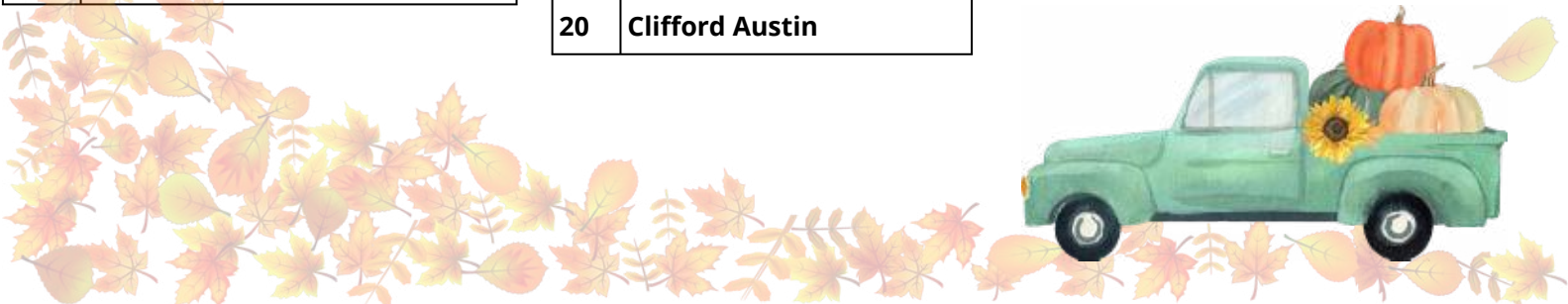

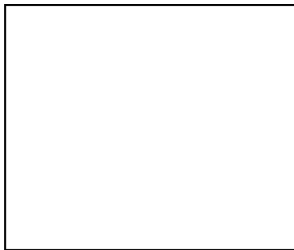
