Happy May! I got bogged down in April with all of the member dues coming in. No, I am NOT complaining. Paying dues is a good thing. But I want to talk

about a major change in lodge security. **We are switching to a new method for members to unlock the lodge's inner door.** It is a plastic white RFID card that looks and acts very much like the plastic room cards that you receive when renting a hotel room. This plastic card will unlock the inner lodge door if you are a paid up member. Please do not lose or damage or throw away this card. It is PERMANENT. The lodge is paying for the initial card, but if your RFID card is lost or damaged, you will have to pay for another card to be issued. Each year you will still be issued your member

card for the current year. If you remember from initiation, the way you prove yourself an Elk is to display your (current year) member card. That paper membership card gives you access to this lodge and to any other lodge in the USA....but it will not unlock our lodge door! You must use your permanent RFID plastic card to do that. No longer will you have to struggle and have to use two hands to unlock the door.

The RFID card will read if it gets close to the reader. No more digging in purse or wallet or pocket. Hands free. doesn't that sound great???? I think so. Keep using the old green member card for the 22/23 year to unlock the door...until the card doesn't work any more.

Last night saw a new group of candidates go through their Orientation and practice for tonight's Initiation. Upon taking their Obligation, they will become an equal member of the Order.

That is great, and it is exciting to see our Lodge grow! But what does the Obligation really mean? During Orientation candidates are told to use [ELKS.ORG](http://ELKS.ORG) as a resource, so taking my own advice I did some searching. I uncovered this gem to share with you this month.

### THE ELKS OBLIGATION

*The obligation which is assumed by every member of the Order, as an essential part of their initiation, involves certain duties which are necessarily implied, as well as those which are formally expressed.*

*By that obligation, so assumed, they become a member of the Order of Elks, not merely a member of their own Lodge. The rights and privileges thereby conferred upon them include the right to attend the meetings of any club house maintained by such other Lodge, in accordance with its rules and regulations relating thereto. And, they are as much amenable to the Statutes of the Order as they are to the By-laws of their own Lodge.*

*They are entitled to participate in the deliberations of their own Lodge; and it is their duty to attend its meetings for that purpose, with proper regard for other duties which may also rest upon them. They share the responsibility for its acts; and they should, by their vote in Lodge sessions and by the appropriate exercise of their influence, endeavor to have those acts reflect their own views. But, they should, with good grace, yield to the majority will, when it has been duly registered. The charitable and benevolent activities of their Lodge frequently require the personal attention of members other than its officers. Each member should readily respond to any official call upon them for any fraternal service that may be within their reasonable capacity to render.*

*It is only by the continued display of such a spirit of fraternal cooperation that their Lodge can maintain itself as the instrumentality of community service it is designed to be. And, it is only by generously putting their individual service into this fraternal association that they will secure for themselves the greatest measure of satisfaction and happiness which should accompany membership in the Order.*
