2024 Oregon State Elks Association's Convention



This year's Oregon State Elks Association's Convention was April 26th and 27th. We left with high hopes that our efforts this year may be recognized with some hardware to bring home for our lodge... and it did.

We received three ENF Awards. 2023-2024 OSEA First Place Winner for an annual total of \$29,810.88. 2023-2024 OSEA Second Place Winner for a per capita amount of \$37.54 per member and 2023-2024 North District First Place Winner for a per capita amount of \$37.55. We were also awarded a 2023-2024 OSEA Top Ten Membership Gain award for having plus 112 members for this year and we were also presented with the 2024 Ritual Contest First Place Team award as well as individual Ritual Awards for Sean Williams, Eric Micheal, Sundee Hamrick, Amy Davidson, Lisa Micheal, Anna Corradine and Cindy Summers.

Speaking of individual awards, Sean Williams won the 2024 OSEA Officer of the Year Award! He also was awarded Best Overall for the 11th Hour Toast and Flag Ceremony. Ron Summers won First Place for the ER's 11th Hour Toast Competition. Americanism Essay Contest Winners wrote about "What The Bill of Rights Means To Me" and from our lodge were First Place in Division 1, Ambrose Prussic, Second Place in Division 3 Aiden Williams, Third Place in Division 3. We had two members installed as State Officers. David Backlund as State Vice President and Dean Lemire as State Organist.

As always, we had a wonderful time at this year's OSEA Convention. We rubbed elbows with the Grand Exalted Ruler Randy Shook, Keith Mills our Oregon State Sponsor and many others. Tami Williams

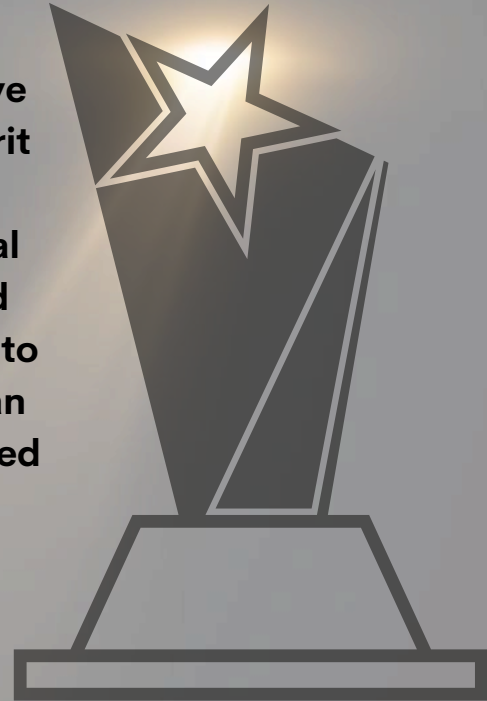
Selecting the Officer of the Year proved challenging due to the limited pool of current lodge officers.

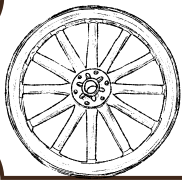

Did you know that the Elks were responsible for the creation and national observation of Flag Day? Here is the background...Patriotism has characterized the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks of the United States of America since the early days of the organization.

Allegiance to the flag of our country is a requirement of every member. In 1907, the Grand Lodge of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks designated, by resolution, June 14 as Flag Day. The Grand Lodge of the Order adopted mandatory observance of the occasion by every Lodge in 1911, and that requirement continues. The Elks prompted President Woodrow Wilson to recognize the Order's observance of Flag Day for its patriotic expression.

But it was not until 1949 when President Harry Truman, himself a member of the Elks, made the proclamation that thereafter June 14 would be a day of national observance for the symbol of our country. It was through his Elks Lodge in Independence, Missouri, that President Truman got the idea for a national observance of Flag Day.

There are plenty of members who are still renewing their dues for the 2024-2025 year. A lot of those members also want Spouse Cards. Did you know that our statutes require that Spouse Cards are to be requested in writing each year? Don't worry, this is very easy to do. Just email the secretary at elks1999.secretary@gmail.com Be sure to include your member number. It's quick and pretty painless. You may want to note Saturday, May 11th on your calendar. It's Paid-Up Member Night! Stop by the lodge between 5 and 7pm for 1-cent drink specials and play 4-5-6. This event is typically in April but there is even more time this year to ensure you get to participate. DON'T FORGET to save your RFID card for entrance to the lodge as these are permanent and are not sent out each year with membership cards. RFID replacement cards are \$25. THANK YOU!!

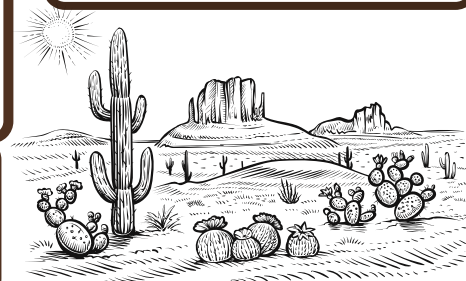

The final part of my duty is: “...by precept and example, inculcate the motto of this station, Charity”.

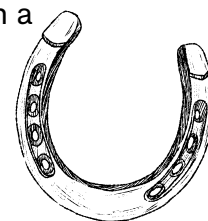

#1, #1, and Top 1% - ENF 2023 - 2024 Wrap Up

Each Lodge is tasked to contribute to the Elks National Foundation (ENF) by the Grand Exalted Ruler with a minimum per-member contribution. Last year’s goal was \$4.80, and reaching that goal is a base requirement for some of the grants we can apply for. The challenge with anything “per-member” is we are a large lodge and need a big number on top for the math to work.

Data basis:

Area 8 = Lodges in OR, WA, ID, MT, WY, ND, SD, AK. There are 264.

Division 6 = Lodges with over 700 members. There are 26 in Area 8.

794 = Number of members at the start of the Lodge year, used for the calculations.

A special shout-out to our 17 Fidelity Club members who have committed to making an automatic monthly donation to ENF.

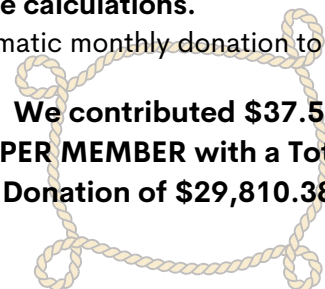
